2018-2019 CALENDAR

This is the place to make sure you get the required days into your school year. Note how many days are required within your state per school year and write that at the top. Then draw a line through any day you plan to take off for vacation or holiday. Draw an X through each day you are in school to keep a record. Check this daily to make sure you're on track with the requirements of your state. The law thing. But simple! Not scary.

Yearly Overview

This is to record your state bench marks and map out a very general outline for what you will focus on for each month. Look at curriculum and State requirements (I printed off the pages for Kindergarten here: corestandards.org). When I taught elementary school, we called this the curriculum map. This isn't the place to go in-depth with lesson plans, just set out a rough outline to make sure you're covering the bases! I've included a sample of a filled in one to help you get the idea if you need.

CURRICULUM LIST

Once you've decided on curriculum, make a list of these tools, their price, and whether or not you've purchased or downloaded them for use. We're piecing together our Kindergarten this year with various free resources found on Pinterest alongside our purchased curriculum, so I wrote down the larger unit resources and where I found them as well.

WEEKLY LESSON PLAN

This is the nitty-gritty! I like to plan weekly so that it's fresh in my mind AND so I can adjust if we need to take more time to master a lesson the following week. There's a space for you to write down the subject and the daily time, and you can use certain times to alternate

different subjects. I don't plan to do Social Studies AND science every day, but alternating in the same time slot. I would write *Social Studies/Science* in the subject line with the time slot. I like to bullet point the lesson details, page # if applicable, activity, any books needed, and worksheet pages for each area of study. Tip: highlight anything that needs extra prep, such as a craft. Obviously, you'll need to print off one per week.

MONTHLY PLAN

This is a great tool if you are planning unit or theme studies without curriculum. Print off as many as you would like for any area of study that you are piecing together yourself. Write in the theme and use bullet points to list all the activities and worksheets per week. We are doing Math by piecing resources together, so instead of theme, I would write in the topic name, such as *addition*. Under activities I would write any adding activities I have for the week, any worksheets,

DAILY SCHEDULE

I enjoy having the day time-blocked to include play time, devotionals, snack time, recess, etc., that is not accounted for in my Weekly Lesson Plan. This is a place to refer to for the flow of your day, but should be held loosely.

MONTHLY CHECK-IN

Print off one of these per school month. At the end of each month, sit down with your kid(s) and ask them what they really enjoy and want more of, and what they might be feeling tired of doing (not a free pass, but insightful to hear!). Add in the things that you notice as well, and encourage a discussion about their weeks.

STUDENT GOALS

It's really great to talk about goals with your student(s), but I recommend writing down the goals you have for them first, and then asking what other goals they have for themselves, especially as the year progresses. Reviewing their goals often is a great motivator!

BOOK LIST

The idea for this page is to print off enough so that you can have one per month. Hey library, you're our new best friend! As you look over curriculum, write down any recommended books for reading. Add in books that correlate with life events and holidays as well. Don't forget to write down the subject, unit, or week the book is for so that you have it when you need it!

FIELD TRIP PLANNER

As you plan field trips, look through curriculum and think about places you could go that would support that learning. It doesn't have to be a museum or expensive ordeal. e.g. planning a trip to a local hiking spot is a great field trip for a study on plant life.
